

Executive Order 2020-003

An Executive Order by the Mayor of the City of Dyer Determining that a State of Emergency Continues to Exist within the City and Directing Certain Actions

WHEREAS, as Mayor of the City of Dyer, I have a responsibility to take all possible actions to ensure the health and safety of the citizens of the City of Dyer;


WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020 the World Health Organization declared the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak was a pandemic and on March 12, 2020, Tennessee Governor Bill Lee declared a State of Emergency to deploy additional resources to combat the spread of the virus, and on March 13, 2020, President Donald Trump declared a National Emergency over the coronavirus pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, I issued Executive Order 2020-001 declaring a state of emergency and setting forth certain policies for the public health, welfare, and safety of the residents of the City of Dyer; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Chris Younger, Mayor of the City of Dyer, Tennessee, by virtue of the executive and administrative authority vested in me by the Charter of the City of Dyer, Tennessee, the Municipal Code of the City of Dyer, and the laws of the state of Tennessee, do hereby declare that a State of Emergency continues to exist within the City of Dyer, and do hereby direct and order the following policies be enacted immediately:

- 1.) The provisions of Executive Order 2020-001 are continued until further notice.
- 2.) In order to encourage compliance with Governor Lee's Executive Order #22 issued March 30, 2020, and to provide relief in this difficult time, water and sewer services will not be disconnected for non-payment until April 14, 2020. This order may be extended.
- 3.) This declaration shall be implemented in accordance with all applicable laws.
- 4.) I further direct that City of Dyer employees take all such steps as may be necessary to protect our city and the residents thereof.
