

Executive Order 2020-004

An Executive Order by the Mayor of the City of Dyer Determining that a State of Emergency Continues to Exist within the City and Directing Certain Actions to Ensure that Essential Services Will Be Provided

WHEREAS, as Mayor of the City of Dyer, I have a responsibility to take all possible actions to ensure the health and safety of the citizens of the City of Dyer;

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, I issued Executive Order 2020-001 declaring a state of emergency and setting forth certain policies for the public health, welfare, and safety of the residents of the City of Dyer; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, I issued Executive Order 2020-003 declaring that a state of emergency continued to exist and setting forth certain policies for the public health, welfare, and safety of the residents of the City of Dyer; and

WHEREAS, I now find that in order to ensure that the City of Dyer can continue to provide essential services including water and sewer services, and public works and public maintenance services, certain staffing changes must be made,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Chris Younger, Mayor of the City of Dyer, Tennessee, by virtue of the executive and administrative authority vested in me by the Charter of the City of Dyer, Tennessee, the Municipal Code of the City of Dyer, the terms of Resolution 2020-313, and the laws of the state of Tennessee, do hereby declare that a State of Emergency continues to exist within the City of Dyer, and do hereby direct and order the following policies be enacted immediately:

- 1.) The provisions of Executive Order 2020-001 and 2020-003 are continued until further notice or their expiration dates.
- 2.) Public Works, Water & Sewer Employees will work on alternating shifts per week beginning on April 7, 2020 until further notice, based on the staffing allocation provided to supervisors. Employees will continue to be paid to shelter in place at their residence and will only perform essential activities while on standby.
